### Council Report Women's Charter Alliance Advisory Committee Update



This Report provides an update on the activities of the Greater Shepparton Women's Charter Alliance Advisory Committee since endorsement by Council on the 21 February 2012. The report covers the period from 21 February 2012 to January 2013.

### About the Committee:

The Committee was formed in response to the Victorian Local Government Women's Charter which was endorsed by Council on 17 August 2010. The aim of the Charter is to support increased participation by women in local government, especially in the areas of gender equity, diversity and active citizenship.

The Greater Shepparton Women's Charter Alliance Advisory Committee is made up of Council Officers and community members and was formally endorsed on 21 February 2012. The Committee aims to progress the Charter principles of gender equity, diversity and active citizenship to create innovative ways to encourage leadership roles for women in all aspects of Council and community decision-making processes.

The Committee meets monthly to progress the Action Plan and discuss/plan activities.
