What is Our Community Plan?

Our community plan is a written document that identifies our vision for the future and the priorities we have identified to achieve this vision. It will guide us in the delivery of the range of projects and facilities over the next decade. Where we may require additional assistance for specific projects, we will use our plan to seek support and funding from a range of relevant organisations including Greater Shepparton City Council.

It must be noted, however, that the issues identified in our plan represent a 'Snapshot in Time'. It is imperative that our plan is reviewed annually so that issues, that are not present at this point in time, can be identified and addressed through the plan. Our plan needs to be a living, flexible document that can adapt to the changing needs of the Community.

Further, achievement of strategies in our plan is dependent upon strong community support; the community being able to sell our ideas effectively to funding bodies; and providing genuine evidence of need.

For the purpose of our community plan, Katandra West refers to the township as well as the district surrounding it, i.e. the area bounded by:

- Katamatite Shepparton Rd (Western boundary down to Lemnos North Road)
- Cosgrove Rd/Katandra Rd (Eastern Boundary)
- Tungamah Boundary Rd/Congupna East Rd (southern boundary)
- Murungi Rd (northern boundary)

Updated Demographics

Katandra West is located 26km north east of Shepparton and is surrounded by farmland. Irrigation channels built in the 1920's changed the landscape and the type of farming that was able to be conducted in the region.

Population The 2016 Census recorded the population of Katandra West is 476 people. This total is made up of 49.5% Male, 50.5% Female with the median age at 43 years old.

Families Data shows 124 families are residing in the area with an average of 1.8 children per family with children.

All Private Dwellings Number of private dwellings sits at 205 with the average people per household being 2.4. Average motor vehicles per dwelling are 2.2

Community Feedback 2018

Extensive community consultation was undertaken as part of the update and review of the community plan to ensure all residents had an opportunity to have their say in the future of our town. 50 individuals contributed their ideas and thoughts.

Community surveys were mailed out to each household, surveys were also available from the Katandra West Store and the Community Centre. The Primary School also promoted and sent out surveys to every family in the school community. A Council representative attended the Thursday night meal at the Reserve and handed out surveys to the other reserve stakeholders including the bowls club, netball and cricket clubs.

Members of the Men's Shed and the Community Plan Committee attended an Activities in the Park activity which was held at the Reserve in March to source feedback.

The Katandra West Community Plan review was also promoted on social media platforms, an article ran in the Shepparton News to encourage community members to have their say and online surveys were available on the Council website.

The draft Community Plan 2018 was distributed in May / June for further community feedback and prioritisaton of actions.





Implementation of the Plan

The Community Plan will continue to guide future projects and activities over the next five years with the ongoing support of the Community. Many of the listed projects will require further research and planning. Some goals are long term and it will take considerable perseverance to progress these actions.

The action plan will be reviewed annually to ensure the priorities remain reflective of the current needs of the Community. The Community Plan Committee is open to the formations of separate working groups who are interested in a specific project within the plan. Community members can contact the Committee at any time to discuss the possibility of forming a working group.

It must be noted that the actions contained within this plan are a shared responsibility between the community and other key stakeholders such as Greater Shepparton City Council. It is preferable that the Community Plan Committee has broad representation from the township and any community members are welcome to join.
