



What is a Community Plan?

Community Planning is planning for the future of an area that is led by the community. The purpose of Community Planning is to give local people greater ownership over their small town or neighbourhood by empowering individuals and groups to take a proactive role in shaping the future of the areas in which they live.

Through information gathering, identification of community assets (community resources) and community engagement, Community Plan Groups are established. Groups are then supported by Council to undertake consultation to develop a Community Plan and a list of actions that the group would like to achieve.

Council partners with Community Plan Groups to implement their plan through advocacy, seeking funding opportunities and building the skills and capacity of the group. Community Plans are reviewed periodically to ensure priorities continue to be relevant to the community.

You've Told Us What's Important!

The Mooroopna Community Plan was first developed in 2010 and continues to play an important role in community driving priorities which are important to them. Community consultation on the review of this plan has included a survey through Shaping Greater Shepparton, feedback boxes at key locations, attendance at Activities in the Park and community events, targeted feedback requests from community and sporting groups, early year's services providers and visits to local businesses.
